## GLCAP / GLC FALL 2023 PROFESSIONAL FELLOWS PROGRAM FOR ALBANIA, BULGARIA, HUNGARY, ROMANIA AND SLOVAKIA

GLC is a program of Great Lakes Community Action Partnership since 1999. GLC is a collaborative effort of the Bowling Green State University, the Lourdes University, University of Toledo and Great Lakes Community Action Partnership.

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Funded by the U.S. Department of State, Bureau of Educational and Cultural Affairs, Global Leaders Division. Organized by GLCAP / Great Lakes Consortium for International Training and Development.

GLCAP (formerly known WSOS) received the FY 2022 Professional Fellows –Renewal grant from the U.S. Department of State to manage a two-way Governance and Society Program entitled 'Empowering Citizen Led Democracy' for emerging leaders from Albania, Bulgaria, Hungary, Romania, Slovakia and the United States between September 2022 and December 2024.

## **PLAN OF ACTION**

Great Lakes Community Action Partnerships (GLCAP) proposed a two-way Governance and Society Program for approximately 21 emerging mid-level leaders from Albania, Bulgaria, Hungary, Romania, and Slovakia and 10 U.S. professional participants. The program, "Empowering Citizen-led Democracy," will galvanize a grassroots base of active citizens to be strong advocates for citizen-led democracy in Eastern Europe. GLCAP will provide inperson, virtual, and blended professional development opportunities for community leaders to develop tools around community organizing, citizen engagement, community-led development, and advocacy. A special emphasis will be placed on participants from, and working with, marginalized and rural communities. The program will allow participants to share ideas, collaborate, and build a global network of professionals dedicated to supporting civic participation and public activism in the United States and Europe. Two groups of foreign fellows will spend approximately six weeks in the United States participating in professional and leadership development activities and individually tailored working placements with



The specific objectives of this program:

- Advance participant and beneficiary cross-cultural competence and global perspective
- Increase the impact that participants and alumni have on their communities
- Strengthen engagement among participants, alumni, beneficiaries, and institutions
- Strengthen personal, professional, and technical abilities and aptitudes
- Increase Capacity of ECA partner institutions to achieve program strategic goals
- Enhance the quality of effectiveness of ECA programs by leveraging the Bureau's resources

Expected outcomes/Results:

- Strengthen civil society sector in Central and Eastern Europe
- Increased transparency and accountability in local governments in these locations
- More resilient and sustainable communities with engaged citizens
- Deeper understanding by participants of the societies, histories, cultures and peoples of other countries, increased appreciation of diversity, and realization of similarities and shared values,
- Lasting and sustainable partnerships between U.S. and European organizations, creating a platform for sharing best practices and crosscultural dialogue.

non-profit organizations, and advocacy groups, followed by participation in the Professional Fellows Congress in Washington, D.C. American participants will then travel overseas to spend approximately two-weeks conducting joint trainings to implement their fellows' individual projects based on their U.S. experience. and working with their foreign counterparts to advance civil liberties, social justice, and civic engagement in their communities.

A flexible three-month, 20 hour, pre-program virtual training component was designed to enhance the Fellows' professional development skills; provide Fellows with an opportunity to share ideas, approaches, and strategies regarding pressing challenges in their thematic area; build a group identity, and facilitate communication between European fellows and U.S. organizations/mentors. This virtual program component was integrated into and served as a springboard for the U.S. fellowship placement component of the program. The trainings focused on community organizing and governance. U.S. alumni mentors provided the trainings with support from European alumni and country directors. The virtual component also helped our fellows to connect with other alumni from around the world through peer-topeer trainings on subjects that are closest to their interest.

The fall 2023 fellows will participate in joint in-person activities before and after their 4-week internship in the U.S. Before the internship in Chicago, Illinois they will have arrival orientation and training with active participation and team building activities. After their internship they will participate in peer-to-peer learning in Washington, D.C. where they share their experience and ideas that they gained at different U.S. host organizations and will discuss how some of the new ideas can be implemented in their home countries.

During the 4-week tailored internship fellows will have various opportunities to gain practical experience and work closely with their U.S. mentors. By the end of their internship participants will prepare 6-month Individual Action Plan for follow-on activities. Multicultural events and participation in volunteer activities as well as other community engagement activities will be included. Fellows will have an opportunity for an on-line training to enhance their leadership skills.

Overall, the 12-member spring 2023 delegation will be involved in 4 U.S. states in 6 U.S. host organizations. Fellows will continue to participate in alumni activities in their country after their return home.
