

We are recruiting US mentors for our Spring 2024 delegation by November 15th!


GLCAP is looking for U.S. professionals in community organizing and advocacy to host 2 European Fellows for four-weeks at their organization in

the Spring of 2024, from approximately May 10 to June 7, 2024. Those selected to be U.S. Mentors will have the potential opportunity for a reciprocal trip to Central and Eastern Europe and will join an international alumni network of over 300 European Fellows and 100 U.S. Mentors.

The European Fellows are mid-career professionals from Albania, Bulgaria, Hungary, Romania, and Slovakia, speak English well, and are leaders in their home communities and organizations. U.S. Mentors are expected to find and coordinate U.S. host families for their European fellows. Stipends for food and transportation will be provided to European Fellows.



Nevena spent 20 days in the US from end of August to mid-September, working with Pioneer Valley Project in Springfield (MA) to further develop competencies on youth electoral organizing. US mentor Ellen Macaulay from Environmental League of Massachusetts also completed her trip to Hungary under our strategic partnerships program. She worked with our Hungarian alumna Zita Szederkenyi on sustainability initiatives and came back to the US end of September.

In the meantime, the trip of Zsanett Fugg (Hungary, Spring 2015) is still ongoing. She arrived at Toledo, OH, where she will continue building a strategic partnership with Bill Hilt and World Affairs Council of Northwest Ohio. European Youth Summit brought 200 people in Romania

Between the 6th and 10th of September, Iași County (Romania) hosted two large-scale events dedicated to young people and youth workers from rural areas. Both events brought together over 200 young people, youth workers and relevant decision makers from 18 countries under the slogan 'From rural to plural'. The events are organized under the umbrella of the European Youth Village Program, which is coled by our alumnus Victor-Catalin Toma.

Bulgarian LGBTI+ movement wins a case in Strassbourg

The European Court of Human Rights ruled that Bulgaria must create a legal framework that allows samesex couples to receive adequate recognition and protection. The court ruled in early September in favour of a same-sex couple, Darina Koilova and Lilia Babulkova, whose marriage in the UK was repeatedly not recognised by Bulgarian institutions. The couple was represented in Strassbourg by our alumna Denitsa Lyubenova (Spring 2017) and the organization Deystvie she leads.

More about Alumni Impact Award Winners Ana Majko and Martin Nagy

Congratulating once again Ana Majko (Albania, Fall 2019) and Martin Nagy (US mentor and advisor since 2013), we link the official press release by the State Depatment, which also includes their impressive bios, showcasing some of their numerous achievements:

Dr. **Ana Majko** has more than a decade of experience in the field of child rights and protection, implementing services for children at high risk, running day centers for children, and providing emergency services for children and parents in need for protection and treatment. She is an expert and trainer on issues related to child trafficking, exploitation, abuse and maltreatment, case management, and emergency response. Since 2016 she has been the executive director of the Initiative for Social Change (ARSIS), a local organization in Tirana focused on strengthening child protection systems in Albania, building community empowerment and engagement, designing and piloting new services, and building capacity in child protection, advocacy and lobbying and policy development in cooperation with public and nonpublic institutions.

Martin Nagy is founder and Executive Director of the Arts Council Lake Erie West (ACLEW), a nonprofit regional community arts agency in Toledo, Ohio that was created in 1983 with a mission to build creativity in the community, increase cultural participation, and engage people in the arts experience. Mr. Nagy is active internationally, consulting, escorting, and conducting workshops through U.S. Department of State-funded programs with Albania, Bulgaria, Hungary, Romania and Slovakia.
